

REFLECTION

Christ Our Sympathy, Christ Our Victory

For the next six weeks our liturgical themes will prepare us for a fresh celebration of the greatest revolution in history: the weekend a Jewish peasant rolled back the tyranny of death and set the world right-side-up again.

As we have been focusing our worship for much of the new year on Jesus as the incarnate Son of God, so now we will celebrate him as the divine Son of Man. When Daniel saw a vision of the glorified Christ (Daniel 7) and described him as "one like a son of man," he was prophesying that the one whose face shined like the sun—that is, with all the splendor of God's being—was also a human being. Christ came down that our human nature might be raised up and actually be given a share in God's nature (2 Peter 1:3-4) That's what all those who love Christ to the end are promised. Do you believe it?

But before the ecstasy comes the agony. Our salvation is an absolutely free gift but it is won by Christ's pain, appropriated by simple, child-like trust on our part, and confirmed by Christ's power working in us, enabling us to follow in his footsteps and bear up under trouble and temptation—not perfectly, but part of what it means that Jesus is human is that he was and continues to be our great Sympathizer. He entered so fully into the pain and brokenness of our fallen world that he knows—not because he is God but because he was and remains human—exactly what afflicts and wounds us. He knows this not generally but specifically. Are you tormented in temptation by desire for things that you know it would be wrong to get—say, revenge, or unlawful sexual pleasures? So was Jesus; he suffered when he was tempted. Do you carry great sadness in your heart, the accumulation of a hundred injuries and disappointments? Jesus knows how you feel: he was a man of sorrows. Do you often feel alone, even in a crowd? Jesus knows what it's like: he remembers being all alone, his disciples gone or else hopelessly out of touch with what was happening.

Each of the next six weeks we will focus on one particular thing Jesus suffered in which he can sympathize with us: Christ, the Divine Son of Man.

Let Christ's deep sympathy with you be an encouragement to you for whatever is hard right now. But remember, Jesus not only feels all that's wrong with the world; he began to overcome it when he set his face like flint, as Isaiah once prophesied he would (Isaiah 50:7), bound for Jerusalem, resolved to obey God, determined to die.

If you trust that Jesus endured all of it for you, then you can know why you're here this morning: to thank him.
