Bless the Lord, O my soul.





Confession of Sin The Ten Commandments

- I. I am the LORD your God, who brought you out of the land of Egypt, out of the house of slavery. You shall have no other gods before me. [pause] **But we have made gods of many things.**
- 2. You shall not make for yourself a carved image, or any likeness of anything that is in heaven above, or that is in the earth beneath, or that is in the water under the earth. You shall not bow down to them or serve them, for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and the fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments. [pause] But we have made idols—whether physical intellectual, emotional, or spiritual—of so many false gods.
- 3. You shall not take the name of the LORD your God in vain, for the LORD will not hold him guiltless who takes his name in vain. [pause] But we have misused your Word and profaned your Name.
- 4. Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy. Six days you shall labor, and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, you, or your son, or your daughter, your male servant, or your female servant, or your livestock, or the sojourner who is within your gates. For in six days the LORD made heaven and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy. [pause] But we are too afraid or busy to set aside a whole day in the week to remember You.
- 5. Honor your father and your mother, that your days may be long in the land that the LORD your God is giving you. [pause] But we have failed to honor those God has placed in authority over us.
- 6. You shall not murder. [pause] But we have murdered—in our hearts and minds if not also with our hands.
- 7. You shall not commit adultery. [pause] But we are an adulterous people—in our hearts and minds if not also with our hands.
- 8. You shall not steal. [pause] But we have stolen—in our hearts and minds; in our defrauding of others; if not also with our hands.
- 9. You shall not bear false witness against your neighbor. [pause] But we have lying tongues.
- 10. You shall not covet your neighbor's house; you shall not covet your neighbor's wife, or his male servant, or his female servant, or his ox, or his donkey, or anything that is your neighbor's. [pause] But we covet all we see. Lord Jesus, forgive us!

Confession of Faith

Westminster Confession of Faith, from Chapter 23 (1647)

God, the Supreme Lord and King of all the world, hath ordained civil magistrates to be under him, over the people, for his own glory and the public good, and to this end hath armed them with the power of the sword, for the defense and encouragement of them that are good, and for the punishment of evil-doers.

It is lawful for Christians to accept and execute the office of a magistrate when called thereunto; in the managing whereof, as they ought especially to maintain piety, justice, and peace, according to the wholesome laws of each commonwealth, so, for that end, they may lawfully, now under the New Testament, wage war upon just and necessary occasion....

It is the duty of people to pray for magistrates, to honor their persons, to pay them tribute and other dues, to obey their lawful commands, and to be subject to their authority, for conscience' sake.

Communion in Christ Jesus

All Christians are invited to receive Christ's presence of bread and wine. When directed please take your bulletin, stand and form a circle around the worship space. Whether you intend to take communion or not, please join us in the circle. If you are not able to stand, please move your chair into the circle. We serve wine in the outer rings of the tray in the Lord's Supper, believing it to be the Biblical element used. We provide grape juice in the inner rings for those who, out of conscience or for health, do not drink wine.

REFLECTION

What Good Is Government?

The institution of civil government is for the purpose of restraining evil and promoting good in the whole body politic.

Civil magistrates are sent by God "to punish those who do wrong and to commend those who do right" (I Peter 2:14.). Notwithstanding all the miscarriage of justice and all the faults that have characterized civil government in the course of history, the purpose of this divine institution has not

completely failed. The Roman state in the days of the apostles was characterized by gross corruptions that defeated the very end for which government was instituted.

Yet it was of such government that Paul could say, "For rulers are not a terror to good conduct, but to bad. Would you have no fear of the one who is in authority? Then do what is good, and you will receive his approval, for he is God's servant for your good. But if you do wrong, be afraid, for he does not bear the sword in vain. For he is the servant of God, an avenger who carries out God's wrath on the wrongdoer." (Rom. 13:3-4) While particular governments do themselves often perpetrate the grossest injustices, yet the testimony of Scripture and of experience is that apart from the restraints imposed and the order promoted by civil government the condition of this world would be one of moral and economic barbarism.

Civil government as such is not a redemptive ordinance. But it provides, and is intended to provide, that outward peace and order within which the ordinances of redemption may work to the accomplishment of God's saving purposes. It is on this basis and to the end of fostering in believers the recognition and appreciation of it that Paul says to Timothy, "First of all, then, I urge that supplications, prayers, intercessions, and thanksgivings be made for all people, for kings and all who are in high positions, that we may lead a peaceful and quiet life, godly and dignified in every way" (I Tim. 2:1, 2).

The tranquility and order established and preserved by the ordinances of government are benefits enjoyed by all. This blessing arising from divine institution we must regard therefore as a common blessing and therefore as one of the institutions of common grace.

The evidence drawn from Scripture, then, compels the conclusion that the world as a whole, though subject to the curse [that came on it through] sin, receives the showers of manifold blessing, that men who still lie under the divine condemnation of sin, including even those who will finally suffer the full weight of that condemnation in perdition, are the recipients in this life of multiple favors that proceed from God's lovingkindness.... So that viewing God's government of this world, even from the aspect of his common or non-saving grace, we may say, the earth is full of the glory of the Lord and all peoples see his glory.
