REFLECTION

Love and the Commandments

Jesus shatters many common notions. For example, one notion is that commandments and love don't mix. You don't command someone you love. And you don't tend to love one who commands. Commanding connotes military hierarchy, not relationships of love. We tend to think that commanding restricts winsomeness and willingness both ways. And this is often true. Paul wrote to his friend Philemon and said, "though I have enough confidence in Christ to order you to do that which is proper, yet for love's sake I rather appeal to you" (Philemon 8-9; see also 2 Corinthians 8:8). Paul probably meant his love and Philemon's love. So it's true for love's sake that a person in authority may chose not to command.

But Jesus shatters any absolute dissociation of commandments and love. He says "If you love Me, you will keep My commandments...He who has My commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves Me; and he who loves Me shall be loved by My Father" (John. 14:15,21). "If you keep my commandments, you will abide in My love; just as I have kept My Father's commandments, and abide in His love" (John. 15:10). Thinking in terms of commandments and obedience did not stop Jesus from enjoying the love of his Father. And he expects that our thinking of him as one who commands will not jeopardize our love relationship with him either.

This is crucial to realize because the covenant relationship that we have with God through Jesus Christ is not a covenant without commandments. The basic difference between the old covenant offered by God and through the law and the new covenant offered by God through Christ is not that one had commandments and the other doesn't. The basic difference is that in the old covenant the gracious enabling power to obey was not poured out as fully as it is since Jesus. "To this day the Lord has not given you a heart to know or eyes to see or ears to hear" (Deut. 29:3). What's new about the new covenant is not that there is no law, but rather God's promise, "I will put my law within them, and on their heart I will write it" (Jer. 31:33). "I will put my Spirit within you and cause you to walk in My statutes" (Ezek. 36:27).

What makes love possible between us and God who commands is that he does not speak from a distance and leave us to our own resources. He draws near and gives us Himself as he gives us his commandments. The new covenant, sealed by the blood of his Son (I Cor. 11:25), is a commitment to put his Spirit within us. Paul said it is a "new covenant, not of the letter, but of the Spirit; for the letter kills, but the Spirit gives life" (2 Cor. 3:6). When the law, written on stone, meets an unwilling heart of stone, all it does is condemn and kill. But when that same law is written on hearts made soft by the Spirit, the result is life.

Therefore we do not need to shrink back from the "commandments" of God as though they were cold, distant demands from an impersonal sovereign. We can embrace the full New Testament teaching that the commandments of God are utterly crucial in living the Christian life. Yes "keeping the commandments of God" really matters!
